- 2025 WSC was held in person at Marriott Hartford/Windsor Airport Hotel, 28 Day Hill Road, Windsor, CT 06095 from **April 24 – 27, 2025**; and the stepping stones visit took place on Monday, April 28, 2025.
- 2025 WSC was the 65th annual conference so all 2025 delegates are referred as Panel 65 – Delegate
- The 2024 WSC theme was: **Investing in Each Other to Preserve Our Legacy**
